Energy Saving Tips

- **Replace your light bulbs.** Replace regular light bulbs with energy efficient compact fluorescent light bulbs (CFLs). CFLs consume 66% less energy and last up to 10 times longer!
- **High-tech temperature control.** Turn your thermostat and air conditioning down when you are away from home.
- **Check your Insulation.** You spend the most money on heating and cooling your home. Inadequate insulation is often the culprit of energy leaks.
- **Colder is Better.** Wash clothes in cold water whenever possible. About 90% of the energy used by a washer goes to water heating.
- **Unplug.** Home electronics, like computers and televisions, can leak energy even when they are turned off.
- **Restrict the Flow.** A flow restrictor typically costs less than a dollar but can cut the cost of taking a hot shower in half.
- **Keep it Closed.** When baking, don't open the oven door to take a peek. Opening the door lowers the temperature inside - by as much as 25 degrees. This increases cooking time and wastes energy.

Minnesota Cold Weather Rule What you need to know.



WHAT IS THE MINNESOTA COLD WEATHER RULE?

Some members find it difficult to pay their utility bills in the winter. The State of Minnesota established the Cold Weather Rule to protect residential heat-affected members, who are unable to pay their utility bills, from disconnection of service between October 15 and April 15.

You may qualify for protection if you meet the following conditions:

- Disconnection would affect your main heat source.
- Your total household income is at or below 50% of the state median income.
- You enter into a payment plan with Sioux Valley Energy and make timely payments under the plan.

WHAT DO I HAVE TO DO TO BE PROTECTED BY THIS RULE?

- Complete the form on this brochure and return it to Sioux Valley Energy by October 15.
- Provide documentation to Sioux Valley Energy that your total household income is at or below 50% of the state median income. This information is included in your Income Tax Return. If you qualify for energy assistance through the Southwestern MN Opportunity Council, this requirement has been satisfied.

AVOIDING DISCONNECTION:

The Cold Weather Rule does not forbid winter shut off. If you receive a shut off notice this winter, you must act promptly. Call Sioux Valley Energy to apply for Cold Weather Rule protection and set up a payment plan. Your service will be subject to disconnection without further notice if you do not make the agreed upon payments.

RECONNECTION: If your power is disconnected on October 15 when the Cold Weather Rule takes affect, you can have your power reconnected by calling Sioux Valley Energy to set up a payment plan. You must keep your payment plan to avoid future disconnection.

WHO CAN I CONTACT FOR MONETARY HELP IN PAYING MY ELECTRIC BILL DURING THE WINTER?
